Proposal

City Planning Staff have received a number of inquiries, one resulting in an application, related to the potential assembly of single family dwelling lots designated *Neighbourhoods* in the City of Toronto Official Plan along the south side of Lawrence Avenue West in the blocks between Shermount Avenue and Glenmount Avenue. Most of the inquiries propose intensification in the form of townhouses or stacked townhouses which are not a prevailing building type in this *Neighbourhood*. Planning staff have initiated a study of the 38 lots to determine an appropriate development framework for the properties within the study area as shown on the key map.

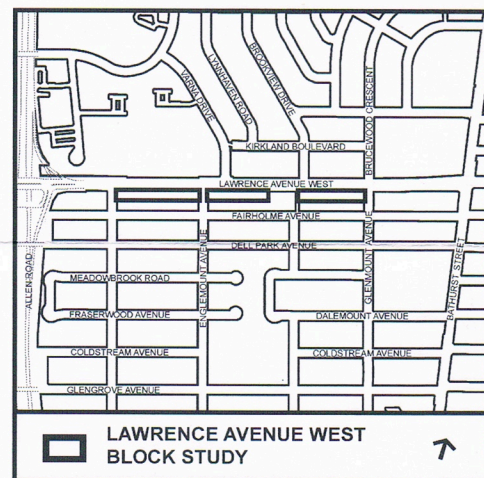
